Have you taken time to collect the plastic grocery bags and bring to the church to help create mats for homeless people around the world?

It doesn't matter what you do to help spread the Word — It matters that you do something. The members of the US basket ball team each had to stretch and work at fever pitch to finally get the gold. Even those on the bench had the responsibility of cheering and encouraging those working on the floor. Cheers may be public words of appreciation, but a simple smile and word of thanks, especially if you are specific in your thanks, is equally renewing of spirit for a laborer in the Lord's vineyard.

The Paris Olympics are now history but His Kingdom is still functioning, so no time to go into retirement. Ignite your spirit. Crank up your skills. Go job hunting if you're currently a wall flower. Even simple dandelions brighten a yard or cheer a shut-in. So, go now. Hop outside and find a bunch and share. Then, remember your "Home Country." We are heaven bound. This World is Not Our Home.
